This term we have been using FINE MOTOR STATIONS. On arrival at school each day we practise these skills to strengthen our fingers and hand muscles.

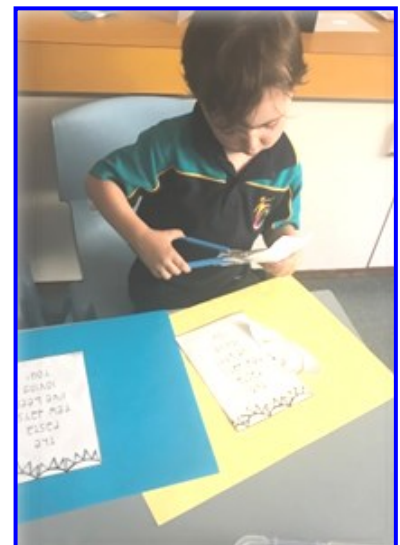
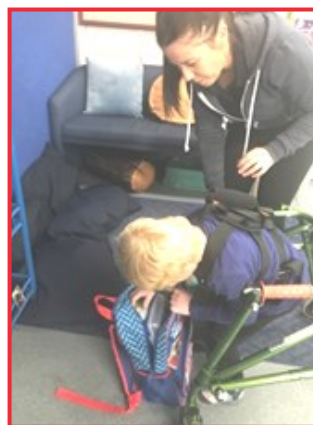
We have all really enjoyed trying different equipment, materials and procedures each morning.

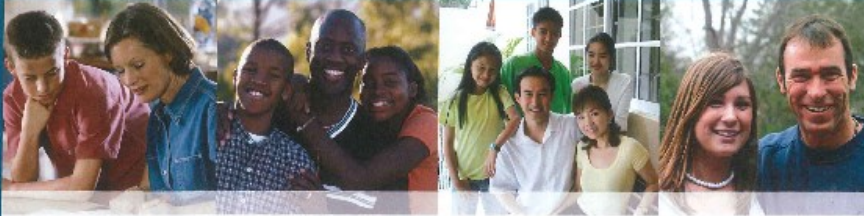
